

# THE PUBLIC BROADCASTING CORPORATION OF JAMAICA ACT

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## The Public Broadcasting Corporation of Jamaica (Amendment) Regulations, 2010

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In exercise of the power conferred upon the Minister by section 3(2) of the Public Broadcasting Corporation of Jamaica Act, and of every other power hereunto enabling, the following Regulations are hereby made:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Broadcasting Corporation of Jamaica (Amendment) Regulations, 2010, and shall be read and construed as one with the Public Broadcasting Corporation of Jamaica Regulations, 2002 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations).

2. Regulation 2 of the principal Regulations is deleted and the following substituted therefor -

“Constitution of Corporation. 2. - (1) The Corporation shall consist of not less than eighteen members and not more than twenty-one members as specified in paragraphs (2), (3) and (4).

(2) The Financial Secretary or his nominee and the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation shall be *ex officio* members of the Corporation.

(3) One member shall be a person who is an employee of the Corporation, nominated by the employees of the Corporation.

(4) The other members (hereinafter referred to as appointed members) shall be appointed by the Governor-General by instrument in writing, after consultation with the

Prime Minister and the Leader of the Opposition, and shall consist of -

- (a) one member who is between the ages of eighteen and twenty-five years (during the tenure of his appointment), as a representative of youth; and
- (b) at least one person representing each of the following fields of expertise, selected on the basis of his appearing to the Governor-General to be knowledgeable and experienced in the field of expertise that the person represents, namely -

- (i) education;
- (ii) sports;
- (iii) arts and culture;
- (iv) electronic media or print media;
- (v) journalism;
- (vi) religion;
- (vii) business;
- (viii) accounting;
- (ix) law;
- (x) worker representation;
- (xi) women's rights;
- (xii) human rights advocacy;
- (xiii) community development; and
- (xiv) welfare of persons with disabilities.

(5) For the purposes of these Regulations, "electronic media" means one or more of the following,

namely, television broadcasting, radio broadcasting or  
cable television broadcasting.”
